Rural Orphans Fostering Project

There are over 570,000 rural orphans at the present time in China, of whom some 300,000 are living in poverty. Unfortunately, there is no special government organization for these orphans. Many of the children live with their grandparents who usually become old and invalid, and consequently do not have the ability to take care of the children.

Objective

- -To give foster care to orphans in rural China and enable them to experience a normal childhood and education. Priority is given to girls.
- E-Action: Love For Orphans
 The Amity Foundation began the orphans
 Fostering project in 2000, which has successfully
 sponsored over 6,400 poor rural orphans in a
 period of 8 years. In the spring of 2007, we
 launched a plan called E-Action, aimed at helping
 more orphans through the internet.

China has experienced a rapid economic growth in recent years and the government increases it's commitment to the compulsory education of pupils year by year. However, due to the big gap in the economic growth between the east and west, some people in remote rural areas still live in poverty and cannot afford the educational costs of their children. As a result, the Back to School Project will continue to help poor students in the west regions with their study and living costs and give greater priority to the senior high school students.

Collapsing School Rebuilding

This primary school, located in the northwest of Yunan Province, houses 300 students and 8 teachers. Behind the school are rows of houses made of mud facing the danger of collapsing. It costs about 600,000 or 700,000 to build a new school (including new teaching buildings, a playground, boundary walls and the toilets for these rural children. Between 200,000CNY and 250,000 was raised by The Amity Foundation and the rest was awarded by the local government.
